



Davyhulme Primary School Admissions policy for Nursery Places.



Introduction

All 3 year olds in Trafford LA are entitled to free nursery provision for 3 hours a day or the equivalent of 15 hours a week, in line with Local Authority guidance. Children are admitted into Nursery in the academic year in which they attain their 4th birthday. Working parents may also be entitled to an additional 15 hours per week which is known as '30 Hours Free Childcare'. Aims

The aims of this policy are as follows:

- To provide a fair system whereby children are given their entitlement of Nursery Education.
- To ensure our provision promotes secure foundations for future learning.

Criteria for Admission

Places for admission to Davyhulme Nursery will be offered according to the following criteria:

1. 'Looked after' children and children who were previously looked after but immediately after being looked after became subject to an adoption, residence, or special guardianship order. A looked after child is a child who is (a) in the care of a local authority, or (b) being provided with accommodation by a local authority in the exercise of their social services functions.
2. Those children who live in the catchment area of Davyhulme Primary School, who will have a sibling attending the Primary School at the time of the applicant's proposed admission (this includes half/step/adopted/foster brothers or sisters, and any other children, who are living at the same address as part of the same family unit).
3. Those children who live in the catchment area of Davyhulme Primary School.
4. Children, who live outside the catchment area of Davyhulme Primary School, with a sibling attending the school at the time of the applicant's proposed admission (this includes half/step/adopted/foster brothers or sisters, and any other children, who are living at the same address as part of the same family unit).
5. Children who live nearest to Davyhulme Primary School, calculated in a direct straight line from the child's permanent place of residence to the school.

For the home address, the distance will be calculated using property co-ordinates provided from Trafford's Local Land and Property Gazetteer (BS7666) and Royal Mail Postal Address Information. In the case of a child living in a block of flats, co-ordinates will be

obtained in the same way. The co-ordinates used for each school are held in Trafford's School Admissions and Transfer system and are listed in the Alphabetical List of Primary Schools contained in Trafford's Composite Prospectus, published on Trafford's website under the title "Starting Primary School"

If there are more applicants than can be accommodated at Davyhulme Nursery in criteria 1-4, places will be offered to those children in each criterion whose place of residence is nearest to the school as defined in criterion 5.

Where two or more applications cannot be otherwise separated, the final place will be determined through a random draw. The draw will be conducted and scrutinised by persons independent from the School, and from the Children, Families and Wellbeing Directorate

Application Process

The school maintains an Enquiry register and parents are invited to register their child's information with the school at their earliest convenience. At that time, parents and children are given the opportunity to visit the Nursery, to meet the staff and familiarise themselves with the nursery. Application forms can be obtained from our school office. These are available throughout the academic year.

In order for children to be allocated places in September, the deadline for applications to be given to us is **31st January** of the year the child is due to begin nursery. Offers of places are sent by mid-February. The deadline for accepting a nursery offer is **19th March**.

If applications are submitted to Davyhulme Primary after this date, it is not guaranteed that your child will be included in the places offered during the Spring Term. Offers of places in our nursery are made on the above admissions criteria.

Organisation of Intake

Since September 2010 the entitlement to free universal nursery provision has been 15 hours per week. From September 2017 eligible working parents can apply for 30 hours free childcare.

At Davyhulme Primary School we offer a mix of full and part time places, taking parent preferences into account, wherever possible.

Due to demand for places, it may not always be possible to give everyone their preference.

For those accepted for 30 hours entitlement the sessions will run 8.30am-3.30pm Monday to Fridays. Not included in these hours is a one hour lunchtime session. Parents must provide a packed lunch for their child and a charge of £4 per day would be payable via parentpay for lunchtime supervision. Payment to be made termly in advance.

Induction Process at Davyhulme Nursery

What to expect following a nursery offer;

- All parents /carers will be invited to either a virtual or a Welcome meeting at school with the Headteacher, Early Years Staff and Early Years Foundation Stage Leader. All appropriate forms will be completed at this stage.

All children are invited to attend an induction session in the **July** before they begin nursery.

- All children who intend taking up a place at our nursery will receive a home visit or a virtual visit from 2 members of Nursery Staff. This is a chance for parents to ask any questions regarding this important phase of their child's life. This will take place at the beginning of **September**.
- To make the transition easier for the children, admission in September will be staggered in groups. This information is given directly to parents so they know in advance when their child will be beginning Nursery.

Criteria for 'Top-up'

If places become available, parents may be given the option to purchase 'Top Up' sessions. The criteria for admissions will apply if limited places are available.

Top up sessions will have to be agreed on an academic year basis and payment for the sessions will need to be paid in advance as laid out in the contract.

Top up sessions are available on a full-time basis i.e. 5 morning or 5 afternoon sessions per week as well as the free entitlement sessions. Lunchtime supervision would be chargeable at a cost of £4 per day. Parents must provide a packed lunch for their child.

Please note charges will be made for sessions even when a child is absent due to sickness or a holiday. Details on charges for top up sessions are available from the office.

Non-Payment fees:

If payment has not been received according to the school's payment structure then the child's place for top up will be removed.

Equality Statement

Davyhulme Primary School is committed to ensuring equality of education as well as equality of opportunity for all children, staff, parents and carers that are associated with our school. We do this by;

We are keen to make sure that we make it as easy as possible for disabled children, young people and adults to be involved in every part of school life. We have a legal duty not to discriminate against disabled people and to monitor how many of our pupils, staff, parents/carers and governors are disabled under the Disability Discrimination Act 2005.

If your child is allocated a place at Davyhulme Primary School Nursery it does not mean that your child will automatically be allocated a place in a Reception class.
